Dorcas McClean Travelling Scholarship for Violinists

Regarded as one of the country's most prestigious awards for young violinists, the Dorcas McClean Travelling Scholarship aims to support Australia's next generation of outstanding performers through the provision of generous travelling scholarships and prizes. *The winner will receive \$40,000 to further develop their musical education overseas, with second and third place performers to receive \$10,000 and \$5,000 respectively.* Assessment is by competition, which will be comprised of a preliminary round (an online application plus a video submission), a semi-final round where up to 6 semi-finalists will present recitals on 30 and 31 January, 2025, and a final round where the selected finalists will present one complete concerto by Mozart with the MCM orchestra on 2 February, 2025. The second Australian National Violin Conference (ANVC) will run concurrently with the competition finals and will present performances, lectures and presentations exploring the rich heritage of Australian violin playing and teaching, its roots and traditions, and leading exponents of violinists through the generations.

Please see the Dorcas competitions Entry <u>Guidelines</u> for entry and eligibility details (also located under <u>Aplication Details</u>). The award is to support admission to a course of study at an approved institution or teacher. The competition semi-finals and finals will be recorded and telecast in both radio and video media. - 2. With the exception of compositions written for unaccompanied violin, applications should include piano accompaniment as appropriate. Videos featuring performances with orchestral accompaniment are welcome, but piano reductions are acceptable.
- 3.Applicants may submit one video containing all works, separate videos for each work, or links to selected works. If submitting all works in one video, recordings may be paused between each repertoire selection.
- 4.Each work on the video must be a continuous and unedited performance. The recording must be high quality and representative of the applicant's capability. It would be preferred if you combine your video into one file and paste a link to your recording on a platform such as SoundCloud or YouTube, or on a file host such as Dropbox or Google Drive. (Please ensure the link is not password protected). There are 2 file upload slots and one text slot for this purpose. If you wish to upload files you must combine them into no more than two files as each file upload slot will only accept a single file.
